## DEER HUNTERS:

Best of luck to a successful and safe hunting season.  
Interesting online hunting information.

Artifacts found in Germany as old as 350,000 years and cave paintings found in France as old as 30,000 years indicate deer hunting has been around since well before the dawn of modern civilization. Back then deer weren't only a source of food, either. Deer hide provided ancient people clothing and carpeting while deer bone provided clubs and fish hooks, along with knives and spearheads. Deer were a necessity for humankind as a source of sustenance, warmth, weaponry, adventure and sharpening instincts. Today values and instincts mean something totally different. The evolution of hunting over the past 4 million years or so is present in all of us as mankind. As times have changed and hunting has evolved, so too have our means for hunting. Not only have we had a diminished need for deer hunting in our modernized, rationalized society, we also have many more advances for efficient and effective hunting. This combination has devolved our instincts as a race when it comes to tracing deer. These intrinsic adjustments dramatically changed what is needed and how we hunt. With advances in shooting technology and guns that can even shoot and aim themselves, along with such tools afforded us as tree stands and backwoods mules, the deer hunter from over 1 million or even 1 hundred years ago would not recognize the way hunters operate today. The way we hunt today has made leaps and bounds over the past 4 million years. Gone are the handmade spears fashioned from deer bone, bound using deer hide leather, replaced with high caliber rifles accurate enough to allow a novice shooter pick off pencil tip from 300 yards. Also gone is the instinctual need to hunt deer, replaced with the convenience of meat markets on every street corner. But one thing remains; the tradition of the deer hunt is as strong today as it was when mankind first started tracing deer.

## Recipe Corner

### Cheater Baked Beans

2 TBSP Olive Oil  
1 med size Onion finely chopped  
3 cloves Garlic, minced  
1 (15oz) can Tomato Sauce  
½ cup Molasses (not blackstrap)  
2 TSP Mustard Powder  
1 TSP Salt  
½ TSP Ground Allspice  
1 Bay Leaf  
2 (15oz) Cans Navy Beans  
(drained and rinsed) (4 cups)

Preheat oven to 350

Using an oven proof container, sauté onions to caramelize (10 min) add garlic, sauté for 1 min add Tomato Sauce, Molasses, Mustard Powder, Salt, Allspice and Bay Leaf. Cook for 5 min  
Add the Beans, cover and transfer to oven. Bake for ½ hour, stir, cook another 1/2 hour in oven. Sauce will thicken and sweeten, Serve Warm, Enjoy

HALLOWEEN WEBS:



Orb Weaver Spiders are showing themselves lately and perhaps frightening people because this species grows to its full size this time of year, Autumn. They are rather imposing. Having a fused head and throat, eight legs, a fang like a mouth, a huge abdomen, and hairy legs, they look fearsome. However, they are neat and tidy! Nocturnal, they eat their web in the morning to absorb the accumulated dew, leaving no mess. They spin their web all over again to catch pests such as wasps and other insects in that Halloween like web. U.S. Orb Weavers are not poisonous and are afraid of humans! If you have arachnophobia, a simple organic homemade spray will keep them at bay. Mix 1 cup water, ¼ cup hydrogen peroxide, 10 drops lavender and spray around doors etc. in the evening. If you spray a spider it will quickly run away, no need to kill it. Try to adopt the motto “Live and let Live” (a truce between man and nature) if possible.
