## MONTHLY NEWSLETTER

### FEBRUARY FUN FACTS:

February is mostly recognized for [Valentine's Day](#), flowers, and depending on where you are, being incredibly cold! Oddly enough, even though it's just another month, there's a lot of history behind this month of romance and love!

- February fluctuates between having 28 and 29 days per year. The 29<sup>th</sup> day only occurs every 4 years during leap years.
- The length of February was finalized when Julius Caesar remade the Roman calendar and assigned the month 28 days and 29 days. In 713 B.C., February was officially added to the Roman calendar.
- If you were born in February, your birthstone is an amethyst and your flower is a primrose.
- The western zodiac signs in February are Aquarius which is until February 19<sup>th</sup>, and Pisces, which is until February 20<sup>th</sup>.
- Over time, the length of February kept changing. At one point, it had as little as 23 days.
- In the Northern Hemisphere, February is the third month of winter. Meanwhile in the Southern Hemisphere, February is the last month of summer. Between the North and South Hemispheres, February is the equivalent of August.
- The name of February comes from the Latin word "februum" which means purification.
- February was named after a purification ritual which was like an early Roman spring cleaning festival.
- In Welsh, February is sometimes known as "y mis bach" which means "little month."
- February and [January](#) were the last months added to the Roman numeral calendar.





**PRESENT:** Meeting called to order at the Auditorium by Village Clerk Daisha Nolan. The following Trustees answered to roll call: Jake Fuller, Jim Smith, Patti Coughlin, Jim Jonasen, Jeff Buhr. Village Administrator Amy K. Huber, Village Clerk Daisha Nolan, Village Officer Pete Witt and Village Attorney Kyle Torvinen were also present. President Darrell Kyle and Trustee Rocky Nelson were absent.

**POSTING:** The agenda was posted at the Auditorium, Post Office, Midland Marketplace and the Village Website.

A motion was made by Fuller for Jim Jonasen to preside over the meeting in President Darrell Kyle's absence, seconded by Smith. MCU

**REVIEW OF AGENDA:** Items (b) & (f) employee disciplinary data were removed from closed session discussion.

**PUBLIC INPUT:** Dave Meyer asked if the positions for backup plow drivers were posted and requested that interaction between Trustee Rocky Nelson and Public Works employee Dennis Paulson be investigated. **TREASURER'S REPORT:** January's treasurer's report will be presented at the February meeting to assure all year end . A motion was made by Smith to approve the treasurer's report as given, seconded by Buhr. MCU

**PAYMENT OF INVOICES:** A motion was made by Fuller to approve the invoices for payment, seconded by Buhr. MCU


### VILLAGE OF LAKE NEBAGMON:
