MARCH FUN FACTS:

Welcome to the third month of the year—or, if you were born before 150 B.C., the first! According to the oldest Roman calendars, one year was ten months long, beginning in March and ending in December. It may sound crazy, but you can still see traces of this old system in our modern calendar: because December was the tenth month, it was named for the number ten in Latin (*decem*), just like September was named for seven (*septem*). So, what about January and February? They were just two nameless months called "winter," proving that winter is

literally so awful it doesn't even deserve a spot on the calendar.

The birthstone for March is the **aquamarine**. The zodiac signs for March are Aries (March 21 - April 19) and Pisces (February 19 - March 20) The birth flower for March is daffodil.

How St. Patrick's Day Originated

<u>St. Patrick's Day</u> began as a religious holiday to honor St. Patrick, who brought Christianity to Ireland in the fifth century.

The first parade for the holiday occurred in New York City on March 17, 1762. It featured Irish soldiers who served in the English military. In 1948, President Harry S. Truman attended the parade.

In 1991, Congress proclaimed March to be Irish-American Heritage Month to honor the achievements and contributions of Irish immigrants and their descendants who are living in the United States today.
